We recognize that October 31 is Halloween. As always, it is our goal to foster inclusion and school spirit. Students who celebrate this occasion are welcome, but not expected to wear costumes on Monday, October 31st.

The spirit of inclusion also means respect for the decision of those who choose not to participate in some of the day's activities. If students do not wish to wear costumes, they are welcome to come in regular school attire or wear fall colours. As a school, we will make sure that all students—should they choose to dress for the day or not — will feel equally included and respected as part of the Southwood Park P.S. community. Students who choose to wear a costume, are expected to keep the following in mind:

· Stereotypical costumes (i.e., indigenous representations) minimize the lived

experiences of students within our community and are therefore not welcome in our learning community

- · Costumes should not include masks, as these can impair vision, muffle speech and impact student safety
- · Costumes should not include scary images, accessories, or any type of weapon (i.e., blood, gore, replica guns, knives, etc.) that can impact safety or a sense of security

Celebratory Treats

With the significant number of allergies and food sensitivities that students (and staff) have at the school, we are requesting that any food sent to the school for holidays and celebrations be closed and wrapped, with ingredients clearly written on the packaging. If the food products are peanut-free and do not impact any student health concerns in the classroom, the food will not be eaten in class, but may be distributed at the end of the day for students to take home. For birthdays, we are asking that product and food gifts be shared outside of school and not brought to the class to be shared, as some families may not have the means (e.g., time and/or finances) to bring items to school, which can cause distress for some of our students. We recognize birthdays are a special day for students and on their birthday, students are recognized on the morning announcements shared with the class and school. Thank you to all our families and community members for your understanding regarding this policy.
